Project Features

- Keweenaw Waterway CDF is an upland facility in Houghton County, MI located on eastern bank of the Portage River about one mile from the Lake Superior entrance.
- Navigation Project Served: Keweenaw Waterway
- The CDF was constructed in 1987 under authority from Section 123 and has less than five years of capacity remaining.
- Keweenaw Waterway CDF has an area of 21 acres, has a total capacity of 308,000 cubic yards, and receives about 7,500 cubic yards annually.
- The CDF is owned by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources and is operated by the US Army Corps of Engineers.

Beneficial Use Information

- The material in this site is sand.
- Direct transportation access to the CDF is available via road and water.
