

## Saginaw River – Saginaw Bay CDF



### **Project Features**

- Saginaw River - Saginaw Bay CDF is an in-lake island facility in Saginaw, MI located 1.5 miles northeast of the mouth of the Saginaw River.
- Navigation Project Served: Saginaw River
- The CDF was constructed in 1978 under authority from Section 123 and expanded in 1999. Saginaw Bay CDF has five to ten years of capacity remaining.
- Saginaw Bay CDF has an area of 283 acres, has a total capacity of 10,850,000 cubic yards, and receives about 320,000 cubic yards annually.
- The CDF is owned by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources and is operated by the US Army Corps of Engineers.

### **Beneficial Use Information**

- The material in this site has a mixed grain size.
- Direct transportation access to the CDF is available via water only.
