



Toledo Harbor – Island 18 (Grassy Island) CDF



Project Features

- Toledo Harbor - Island 18 (Grassy Island) CDF is an in-lake island facility in Toledo, OH. The CDF is located in Maumee Bay northwest of the mouth of the Maumee River.
- Navigation Project Served: Toledo Harbor
- The CDF was constructed in 1962 under authority from project specific O&M, was expanded in 1977, and has less than five years of capacity remaining.
- Toledo Harbor Island 18 (Grassy Island) Harbor CDF has an area of 150 acres, has a potential total capacity of 5,000,000 cubic yards, and is waiting on repairs before any new material can be received.
- The CDF is owned and operated by the US Army Corps of Engineers.

Beneficial Use Information

- The material in this site has a mixed grain size.
- Direct transportation access to the CDF is available via water only.

Post Closure Use

- The post closure use of Toledo Harbor - Island 18 CDF is intended for a dredged material recycling project.

Toledo Harbor – Site 3 CDF



Project Features

- Toledo Harbor Site 3 CDF is an in-lake facility attached to land in Lucas County, OH. The CDF is located in Lake Erie immediately east of the Toledo Edison power plant with an extension built along the northeast side of the power plant.
- Navigation Project Served: Toledo Harbor
- The CDF was constructed in 1976 under authority from project specific O&M, was expanded in 1994, and has five to ten years of capacity remaining.
- Toledo Harbor Site 3 CDF Harbor CDF has an area of 397 acres, has a total capacity of 16,400,000 cubic yards.
- Recent testing and analysis have indicated that harbor sediments in the river portion are now mostly clean enough for open lake placement making the future need for CDF capacity very limited. Historically, dredged material from the river portion of the harbor has been placed into the CDF and dredged material from the bay portion has been placed in the open lake.
- The CDF consists of cells 1 and 2. Cell 2 of the CDF is owned by the Toledo-Lucas County Port Authority (TLCPA) and is operated by the US Army Corps of Engineers. Cell 1 is owned and operated by TLCPA.

Beneficial Use Information

- The material in this site has a mixed grain size.
- Direct transportation access to the CDF is available via road and water in addition to possible transportation access by rail within one mile of the site.

Post Closure Use

- The post closure use of Toledo Harbor Site 3 CDF is intended for port development and a wildlife area.
