Huron Harbor CDF



Project Features

- Huron Harbor CDF is an in-lake facility attached to land in Huron, OH. The CDF is located adjacent to the west pier at the mouth of the Huron River and Lake Erie.
- Navigation Project Served: Huron Harbor
- The CDF was constructed in 1975 under authority from Section 123 and has greater than ten years of capacity remaining.
- Huron Harbor CDF has an area of 63 acres and has a total capacity of 2,600,000 cubic yards. Dredging quantities have historically amounted to approximately 180,000 cubic yards every 1-2 years.
- Dredged sediments over the past few decades have been placed in the open lake since harbor sediments have been getting cleaner. Future use of the CDF may be very limited since open lake placement will be the likely placement option used.
- The CDF is owned by the City of Huron, OH and is operated by the US Army Corps of Engineers.

Beneficial Use Information

- The material in this site has a mixed grain size.
- Direct transportation access to the CDF is available via road and water.
