St. Clair River - Dickinson Island CDF



Project Features

- St. Clair River - Dickinson Island CDF is upland facility in Clay Township, MI. The CDF is located at the north end of Dickinson Island on Lake St. Clair.
- Navigation Projects Served: St. Clair River and Channels in Lake St. Clair
- The CDF was constructed in 1975 under authority from Section 123 and has five to ten years of capacity remaining.
- Dickinson Island CDF has an area of 174 acres, has a total capacity of 2,000,000 cubic yards, and receives about 40,600 cubic yards annually.
- The CDF is owned by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources and operated by the US Army Corps of Engineers.

Beneficial Use Information

- The material in this site is sand.
- Direct transportation access to the CDF is available via water only.
