Clinton River, MI - Clinton River Confined Disposal Facility (Clinton River CDF)



Project Description

- Navigation Project Served: Clinton River, Michigan
- The facility is owned by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources
- The facility is operated and maintained by the Detroit District, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers
- Clinton River CDF is an upland facility in Mount Clemens, MI. The CDF is located at river mile 3.0, adjacent to the Selfridge Air National Guard Base.
- The Clinton River CDF has an area of 30 acres, has a total constructed capacity of 370,000 cubic yards, and receives about 20,000 cubic yards every three to five years. The CDF has an approximate remaining capacity of 75,000 cubic yards.
- Non-Federal interests may use this disposal facility if it is determined that the capacity to be used by the non-Federal interest will not reduce the availability of the disposal facility for Federal navigation project purposes, that the material is environmentally acceptable, and after payment of a tipping fee.

Project Authority

- The facility was constructed in 1989 under the authority of Section 123 of the River and Harbor Act of 1970, Public Law 91-611, as amended.
