## Green Bay Harbor, WI - Cat Island Dredged Material Disposal Facility (Cat Island DMDF)



### **Project Description**

- Navigation Project Served: Green Bay Harbor, Wisconsin
- The facility is owned by Brown County
- The facility is operated and maintained by the Detroit District, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers
- The Dredged Material Disposal Facility (DMDF) site is about 6,500 feet out from the head of Green Bay, extending from near the Federal navigation channel northwest about 8,000 feet to the shore of Green Bay.
- The Cat Island DMDF has an area of 274 acres, has a total constructed capacity of 2,350,000 cubic yards, and receives about 150,000 cubic yards every other year. The CDF has an approximate remaining capacity of 1,960,000 cubic yards.

### **Project Authority**

- The facility was constructed in 2013 under the authority of Section 3173 of the Water Resources Development Act of 2007, Public Law 110-114.
