Kewaunee Harbor, WI - Kewaunee Harbor Confined Disposal Facility (Kewaunee Harbor CDF)



Project Description

- Navigation Project Served: Kewaunee Harbor, Wisconsin
- The facility is owned by the City of Kewaunee
- The facility is operated and maintained by the Detroit District, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers
- Kewaunee Harbor CDF is an in-lake facility attached to land in Kewaunee, WI. The CDF is located north of the Kewaunee River on Lake Michigan adjacent to the shore and breakwater.
- The Kewaunee Harbor CDF has an area of 28 acres, has a total constructed capacity of 500,000 cubic yards, and receives about 30,000 cubic yards every three to five years. The CDF has an approximate remaining capacity of 120,000 cubic yards.
- Non-Federal interests may use this disposal facility if it is determined that the capacity to be used by the non-Federal interest will not reduce the availability of the disposal facility for Federal navigation project purposes, that the material is environmentally acceptable, and after payment of a tipping fee.

Project Authority

- The facility was constructed in 1982 under the authority of Section 123 of the River and Harbor Act of 1970, Public Law 91-611, as amended.

Beneficial Use Information

- Direct transportation access to the CDF is available via road and water in addition to possible transportation access by rail within one mile of the site.
