St. Clair River, MI - Dickinson Island Confined Disposal Facility (Dickinson Island CDF)



Project Description

- Navigation Project Served: St. Clair River and Channels in Lake St. Clair, Michigan
- The facility is owned by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources
- The facility is operated and maintained by the Detroit District, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers
- Dickinson Island CDF is upland facility in Clay Township, MI. The CDF is located at the north end of Dickinson Island on Lake St. Clair.
- The Dickinson Island CDF has an area of 174 acres, has a total constructed capacity of 2 million cubic yards, and receives about 40,000 cubic yards every three to five years. The CDF has an approximate remaining capacity of 450,000 cubic yards.
- Non-Federal interests may use this disposal facility if it is determined that the capacity to be used by the non-Federal interest will not reduce the availability of the disposal facility for Federal navigation project purposes, that the material is environmentally acceptable, and after payment of a tipping fee.

Project Authority

- The facility was constructed in 1975 under the authority of Section 123 of the River and Harbor Act of 1970, Public Law 91-611, as amended.
