These four sub-categories are not new exclusions, but are simply administrative distinctions and remain (b)(1) exclusions as defined by the NWPR.



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C. Additional comments to support AJD: Wetland A, a 0.32 acre forested wetland, is situated within a kettle-like depression in the landscape. In 2015, this wetland (formerly delineated as Section III) was determined to be an isolated wetland per the 1986 Regulations and related guidance, as there was no hydrologic connection to a downstream water observed at the December 10, 2014 Corps inspection or documented in the November 23, 2014 Wetland Delineation Report.

Wetland A does not meet the definition of an adjacent wetland to an (A)(1)-(A)(3). Wetland A does not abut Cedar Creek, the nearest (A)(1)-(A)(3) water. A review of aerial photos in multiple years did not depict Wetland A being inundated by floodwaters from Cedar Creek, in any year. Further, Wetland A is not located within the mapped floodplain of Cedar Creek. Wetland A is physically separated from Cedar Creek in the landscape by upland forest and upland agricultural ground. The degree of separation of Wetland A from Cedar Creek is greater than by only a natural feature such as a dune or stream bank. Wetland A does not have a hydrologic surface connection to Cedar Creek via an artificial structure or barrier. Because there is no hydrologic connection between Wetland A and an (A)(1)-(A)(3) water, it does not meet the definition of an adjacent wetland and is therefore considered an excluded water.
