PROJECT: Oakland County, MI

DESCRIPTION: Oakland County is located in southeastern Michigan and includes a northern portion of the Detroit metropolitan area. Implement the Twelve Towns Combined Sewer Overflow Program, which includes numerous improvements to the existing system. The entire Twelve Towns Drainage Improvement Project will be implemented through multiple construction contracts with a total cost of approximately \$144 million. The current projects include inspections of sewers, and inspection and design of regulators. Additional scopes of work may include inspection, evaluation and design of flow meters and level sensors.
