


**PROJECT FACT SHEET**  
**22 January 2004**

**PROJECT:** Upper Peninsula Michigan Flood Recovery and Mitigation

**DESCRIPTION:** The project area is Michigan's Upper Peninsula, including Baraga, Gogebic, Houghton, Iron, Marquette and Ontonagon Counties. The Corps was authorized and directed to repair, restore, and clean up infrastructure and hydrologic features impacted or threatened by flooding. These projects consist of restoration and cleanout of area streams, emergency streambank protection, repair of crucial public infrastructure (including sewer and water facilities), documentation of flood impacts, and execution of other flood recovery efforts deemed necessary and advisable by the Chief of Engineers. All damages from the April 2002 flood events could not be addressed by the FY02 Supplemental Appropriation. Additional flood damages occurred in May 2003 in this region, especially in Marquette, Ontonagon, Gogebic and Baraga Counties. Additional funds will be furnished in FY04.

**NON-FEDERAL PROJECT SPONSOR:** Work is 100% Federal (no official local sponsor). Local communities must furnish LERRs and obtain State permits.

**PROJECT AUTHORITY:** The program is funded under FY02 Supplemental Appropriations (PL107-206, 2 Aug 02) at \$11,923,000 and anticipated Energy and Water Development Appropriations Act, 2004 (PL 108-137) at \$8,400,000 & FY 2003 Emergency Supplemental (HR108-279) at \$2,000,000.

**STAGE:** Final E&D phase for some FY02 funded projects and construction phase for remaining FY02 funded projects. Design and construct FY04 funded projects.

**STATUS:** Construction at five project sites from FY02 is complete. Remaining FY02 funded contracts will be advertised in Winter 2003 for spring construction starts, and work should be finished in 2004. FY04 funding to be used for project recently identified by local communities and counties, looking first at the highest priority projects, then those that are technically simple in scope and can be executed utilizing expedited contracting methods to expend all funds in the fiscal year.

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
