## Soo Locks' Brady Park to get new fence; public comments welcome, information available

**DETROIT** – The United States Army Corps of Engineers, Detroit District will host a public information session for individuals, groups, and agencies to receive information and comment on a proposed project at the Soo Locks' Brady Park.

The Corps is planning to install a wrought iron fence to enclose a portion of Brady Park in Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan as requested by the Native American Indian Tribes in the area to protect a culturally significant area.
