

PROJECT: Northeastern Minnesota Environmental Infrastructure and Resource Protection and Development Program.

DESCRIPTION: The primary objective of this program is to provide design and construction assistance to non-Federal interests for carrying out water-related environmental infrastructure and resource protection projects in a 17-county area in the northeastern part of the State of Minnesota. Projects may include wastewater treatment and related facilities, water supply and related facilities, environmental restoration, and surface water resource protection and development.

CONGRESSIONAL INTEREST: Oberstar (DFL) MN-8, Senators Klobuchar (DFL) and Coleman (R).

STAGE: Currently 19 projects have been authorized under the program within the Detroit District. All projects have signed Project Cooperation Agreements. Two projects were postponed in FY06 due to a lack of funds.

STATUS: PCAs signed in FY06 included projects in the City of Aurora, and the City of Biwabik (6th Avenue Construct). The program received funding for \$3,712.4K for FY06. Those funds were divided with \$2,830.4K going to St. Paul District and \$882K going to Detroit District. Detroit District Funding for FY07 have not been finalized. FY08 funds would be used to select additional projects for design and construction.

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
