


PROJECT FACT SHEET

PROJECT: Oakland County, MI

DESCRIPTION: Oakland County is located in southeastern Michigan and includes a northern portion of the Detroit metropolitan area. Implement the Twelve Towns Combined Sewer Overflow Program, which includes numerous improvements to the existing system. The entire Twelve Towns Drainage Improvement Project will be implemented through multiple construction contracts with a total cost of approximately \$144 million. The USACE has received a \$20,000,000 authority to assist with infrastructure improvements. The current projects include inspections of sewers, and inspection and design of regulators. Additional scopes of work include inspection, evaluation and design of flow meters, level sensors, rollergates, and flushing valves.

STATUS: Per Section 219 requirements, the work is undergoing design by contract. First phase design of regulators completed and sewer inspection is completed. Second phase design contract of inspection, evaluation and design of flow meters, level sensors, rollergates, and flushing valves has been awarded. A new design agreement will be coordinated with Oakland County in FY07 for additional design work to be completed in FY08/09.
