


**PROJECT FACT SHEET**  
**February 27, 2007**

**PROJECT:** Rouge River Watershed (Gateway Area), MI

**DESCRIPTION:** The Rouge River Watershed Gateway Area is downstream of the Supplemental Watershed Management Study area and the most downstream 8 miles of the river to its confluence with the Detroit River in Wayne County, MI. Section 905(b) was approved by 3 June 2004 and recommended evaluation of problems related to fish passage, streambank stabilization, oxbow and habitat restoration, stormwater treatment thru wetland restoration.

**STAGE:** Reconnaissance (Project Management Plan and FCSA)

**STATUS:** Prior to entering a cost shared feasibility study a Project Management Plan and Feasibility Cost Share Agreement needs to be completed. Wayne County, Michigan has expressed interest to become the local sponsor. Six (6) locations have been identified along the Corps of Engineers flood control project for restoration activities: (1) Henry Ford Estate Dam Modification for Fish Passage, (2) Kingfisher Bluff Stabilization, (3) Michigan Ave/Evergreen Rd Stormwater Treatment, (4) TPC Stormwater Treatment, (5) Oakwood Common Oxbow Restoration, and Fordson Island Habitat Restoration. Project to be combined with the Rouge River Supplemental Study.
