

PROJECT: Trail Creek Sea Lamprey Barrier, Michigan City, Indiana - Section 1135 (C-CAP)

DESCRIPTION: Trail Creek flows into Lake Michigan at Michigan City, LaPorte County, Indiana, approximately 7 miles south of the Michigan-Indiana border. The purpose of the project is to construct a sea lamprey barrier and trap on Trail Creek in Michigan City, Indiana. The Trail Creek project includes construction of a steel sheet pile barrier and sea lamprey trap to help restore the ecosystem of the region. A barrier would reduce/eliminate sea lamprey spawning in this stream.

STAGE: Design and Implementation

STATUS: Section 1135 funds are being used to implement the project. The Project Partnership Agreement (PPA) has been executed and a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) for the USACE to acquire real estate needed for the project on behalf of the non-Federal sponsor (NFS) has been signed. Non-Federal funds for the real estate activities have been provided to the Corps. The Real Estate acquisition process is expected to be completed in February 2011. Remaining non-Federal funds are to be received prior to FY11 construction contract advertisement and award, currently scheduled for May 2011.

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
