

PROJECT: Detroit River, Greenway Corridor, Michigan - (I)

DESCRIPTION: This project is located along the Detroit River from the Belle Isle Bridge to just south of the Ambassador Bridge near Riverside Park, a distance of approximately 4.5 miles. Seawall improvement and environmental restoration along the Detroit River. In December of 2002, the Detroit Riverfront Conservancy (DRFC) was created to undertake the redevelopment of the Detroit Riverfront. Their efforts have paralleled the Corps study effort.
