PROJECT: Detroit River, Trenton, Wayne County, Michigan - Section 206 (C-CAP)

DESCRIPTION: The project is located along the northeast shore of the City of Trenton, Michigan, in the lower end of the Detroit River, in Wayne County, in southeastern Michigan. The Detroit River is a recognized Area of Concern. The sponsor has identified the desire to study a 44-acre site for the purpose of aquatic ecosystem restoration and habitat protection as part of the new Detroit River International Wildlife Refuge. Specifically, the sponsor has requested that the Federal focus be a study of soft engineering of the Detroit River shoreline at this site for habitat restoration and conservation in order to protect the ecological buffer for adjacent marshlands and coastal wetlands.
