PROJECT: Genesee County, Michigan - Section 219 (C)

DESCRIPTION: Genesee County is located in southeastern Michigan. The existing wastewater collection and treatment infrastructure has reached its planned capacity. The Genesee County Drain Commission desires to design a Kearsley Creek Interceptor (KCI) sewer system in southeast Genesee County to increase the system capabilities.
