PROJECT: Mackinac Island, Harbor Breakwater, Michigan - Section 107 (C-CAP)

DESCRIPTION: This project is located on the south shore of Mackinac Island, Michigan. The project involves construction of an eastern breakwater extension to protect the inner harbor from strong southeast storm surges. The City of Mackinac Island is dependant on water transportation and accessible from the mainland of northern Michigan only across the often rough waters of Lake Huron.

STAGE: Feasibility

STATUS: A Preliminary Assessment and detailed draft Project Management Plan (PMP) has been prepared for the required feasibility phase study. Upon coordinating and executing a Feasibility Cost Sharing Agreement (FCSA) with the non-Federal sponsor (NFS), a Detailed Project Report (DPR) to evaluate the project could be initiated. However, the NFS has indicated it is not currently positioned to provide the required cost-share match for the feasibility phase study efforts. As such, the project is on hold at this time.

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
