
**PROJECT INFORMATION SHEET**

**PROJECT:** Palmer/Long Lake, St. Joseph County, Michigan - Section 206 (C-CAP)

**DESCRIPTION:** The project is located at Palmer/Long Lake, in St. Joseph County, Michigan and proposes to dredge accumulated sediments from the watercourse which connects Long Lake to Palmer Lake. The project would restore historic flow patterns of this connecting channel and restore the associated aquatic ecosystem to its previous level of quality.
