PROJECT: Secord and Smallwood Lakes, Gladwin County, Michigan - Section 206 (C-CAP)

DESCRIPTION: Secord and Smallwood Lakes are long, narrow, man-made lakes formed from the damming of the Tittabawassee River in Secord Township, Michigan. Over the lakes' history, these aquatic ecosystems supported a diverse, robust native aquatic population with a varied shoreline and shallow-water habitat. The invasive Eurasian Water milfoil has changed the habitat of the lakes since 1994 and has degraded water quality and the habitat for fish and native plants. The project proposes methods to control the milfoil and restore the aquatic habitat for fish and native plants. The milfoil will be removed using chemical, biological, or mechanical means.
