NOTES :

1. Proposal evaluation shall be based upon Lowest Priced Technically Acceptable. To be technically acceptable, offerors shall submit a Schedule that is consistent with the period of performance and provide a list of the equipment that will be used on the project.
2. The schedules obtained for the determination of technical acceptance are not binding and do not become part of the contract.
3. The government may elect to award items 0006,0007, and 0008 in the following order: 0006 – Option 1 dredging; or 0006- Option 1 dredging and 0007-Option 2 dredging; or 0006- Option 1 dredging and 0007-Option 2 dredging and 0008 Option 3 dredging. Items 0006, 0007, and 0008 may not be awarded at the same time.

SCOPE OF WORK

1. Dredging - Mobilize dredge to Green Bay Harbor, WI. and dredge the area shown on the plans. Hydraulic dredging and hydraulic disposal are prohibited. The required dredge areas are CS 5+00B to CS 75+00B, CS 9+00 to CS 5+00B, and CS 143+00B to CS 157+00. The option dredge areas, Option 1 CS 75+00B to CS 110+00B, Option 2 CS 110+00B to CS 140+00B, and Option 3 CS 180+00 to CS 185+00, may be exercised by the Government. The required depths are 20.0', 24.0' and 26.0' below L.W.D. as noted on the plans.

For the Dredge Areas between CS 185+00 to CS 20+00B the Contractor shall use a closed top production bucket in good repair with tight fitting bottom lips and sealing baffles on the top to expel air and water - in order to prevent loss of material as it is lifted through the water column. The intent of requiring the use of a sealed bucket is to minimize the re-suspension of dredged material into the water column. During dredging operations, USACE may conduct upstream and downstream in-situ turbidity monitoring using an in-situ nephelometer.

The upstream (background) monitoring station shall be located approximately 500 feet upstream of the dredging area. The exact location shall be representative of the water that shall pass through the dredge area. The downstream monitoring station shall be located approximately 500 feet downstream of the dredging operation. If a turbidity level corresponding to 80 nephelometric turbidity unit (NTU) above background is measured, the Contracting Officer will determine if any adjustments are necessary. The Contractor shall conduct routine visual observations of water quality to identify potential turbidity plumes that may not be detected or accurately measured by regularly scheduled turbidity monitoring, as set forth above. If such a plume is visually identified, notify the COR immediately.

The dredged material shall be transported and placed in the Bayport Disposal Facility. The Bayport Disposal Facility (BDF) is considered the Government Furnished Disposal Facility. Dredged materials shall be placed within Cell Number 4, as shown on the Contract Drawings. The material shall be placed such that upon completion of placement under this contract the placement area is crowned near the center and shaped to drain toward the perimeter of each area used. The maximum allowable elevation for materials within twenty-five 25 feet of the perimeter of each area is 2.0 feet below the top of the berms. If ramps or finger piers are required within the disposal area to accommodate truck unloading, the use of on site materials and the construction shall be coordinated with Brown County. Such works shall be maintained by the Contractor, and the cost thereof shall be included in the

contract price. Only dredged materials taken from within the limits of this contract and as otherwise required shall be placed in the Government-furnished disposal area. The Contractor shall coordinate its disposal operations with others who may be simultaneously utilizing the disposal facility.

Demobilize when dredging work is completed.

2. Excavation at Bayport Disposal Facility – Mobilize equipment to the Bayport Disposal Facility and excavate 75,000 cubic yards with an option for an additional 50,000 cubic yards from Cell#5 and transport the excavated material to Renard Island. At Renard Island place and grade the transported material to the design contours shown on the plans. The Contractor shall remove the existing vegetation within cell#5 at Bayport in the late fall to facilitate frost penetration. When the ground has frozen sufficiently to support operations the Contractor shall proceed with excavation.

The material to be excavated, see paragraph 5, is from dredging the harbor in 2010. Renard Island was used as a disposal facility for dredged materials until 1997. The ability of the previously dredged material contained in cell#5 and at Renard Island to support a specific type or size of equipment is unknown. The Contractor shall construct roads and structures as necessary to complete the work at no additional cost to the Government.

The Contractor shall grade and repair any existing roads at Bayport and Renard Island damaged by the Contractor's operations. A silt fence has been installed on the perimeter of the island. The Contractor shall maintain or replace the fence as necessary to prevent erosion of materials into the bay. Crane mats owned by Brown County are available for the Contractor's use at Bayport. The Contractor shall document the condition of the mats prior to use and repair or replace any mats damaged by the Contractor's operations. The Contractor shall limit the depth of excavation to avoid damage to the drainage system at the bottom of the cell. The bottom of the cell is approximately elevation 588 and is delineated by the presence of vegetation and gravel. The Contractor shall construct structures and tailor operations to minimize tracking of material onto public roadways. The Contractor shall immediately clean up any materials spilled on the public thoroughfares.

The Contractor shall provide an as built topographic survey in a CADD file of the Renard island placement in sufficient detail including spot elevations and as built contours at a 2 foot interval.

3. The survey information shown on the drawings is based on condition surveys collected on the dates indicated on the Contract Drawings. For dredging line items final pay yardage will be determined by prior to dredging soundings and after dredging construction surveys.

For the excavation line item final pay yardage will be determined by topographical surveys of cell#5 taken on a 25'X25' grid prior to and at the completion of excavation.

4. Payment items for the work of this contract on which the contract unit price payments will be made are listed in the BIDDING SCHEDULE and described below. The unit price and payment made for each item listed shall constitute full compensation for furnishing all plant, labor, materials, and equipment, and performing any associated Contractor quality control, environmental protection, meeting safety requirements, tests and reports, and for performing all work required for each of the unit price items.

Regarding Option Items the Government may elect to award Option Items. If Option Items are awarded, the Government reserves the right to limit the quantity of material up to the Estimated Quantity of the Option Items. See Clause 52.217-7 OPTION FOR INCREASED QUANTITY – SEPARATELY PRICED LINE ITEM (MAR1989). : Clause 52.211-18 VARIATION IN ESTIMATED QUANTITY (APR 1984) is not applicable to Items Nos. 0006, 0007, 0008 and 0009.

6. Character of Materials

The material within the required dredging prism consists primarily of material that has shoaled since the last time the area was dredged. Shoaled material contains silt and sand in varying proportions with organic material. Material dredged from the overdepth prism may consist of shoaled and native material. Native material consists of soft to stiff clay with varying proportions of silt. Gravel, cobbles, and boulders may also be encountered within the native material. Native material is expected to be encountered in the required dredging prism as well as the overdepth prism for the outer portion of the contract dredging. The records of previous dredging and sampling are available for inspection at the Office of the Engineering & Construction Office, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Detroit District, 477 Michigan Avenue, McNamara Building, Detroit, Michigan.

7. Tolerance Dimensions:

Side Slope Tolerance: 25 feet horizontal

Shoal Tolerance: 0.5 feet vertical

8. Special Project Procedures:

a. The Contractor shall be prohibited from requesting opening for the Main Street, Mason Street, and Walnut Street Bridges DURING ANY NONHOLIDAY WEEKDAYS FOR THE FOLLOWING DAILY PERIODS:

(a) 7 a.m. to 8 a.m.

(b) 12 noon to 1 p.m.

(c) 4 p.m. to 5 p.m.

b. Work Period Restrictions – There are no work period restrictions. When the Contractor elects to work when not prohibited herein, notice of its intention to do so shall be given to the Contracting Officer not less than forty-eight (48) hours in advance thereof. Adequate lighting for thorough inspection of night operations shall be provided by the Contractor at its expense.

c. Exclusion of Period in Computing Completion Schedules

There is no winter exclusion period for this contract.

d. Government-Furnished Transfer Site

A facility for access to the river's edge and placement of equipment for transferring dredged materials from scows or other marine hauling equipment to land hauling equipment is provided by the Government at the location shown on the contract drawings. Use of this facility shall be coordinated with others who may be performing work in the area. All contractor's operations shall be confined to the area delineated on the plans. Hauling routes and procedures shall be coordinated with the City of Green Bay. If the Contractor uses this transfer facility, the Contractor shall, every two (2) weeks thru completion of all transfer operations, take soundings throughout the length and breadth of the transfer site within the limits shown and shall remove all materials, within such limits, which exist above the sounding elevations taken by the contractor prior to use of the facility.

The quantity removed is excluded from the quantity measured for payment.

e. A tipping fee to Brown County is not required for this contract.

52.211-10 COMMENCEMENT, PROSECUTION, AND COMPLETION OF WORK (APR 1984)

The Contractor shall be required to (a) commence work under this contract within 10 calendar days after the date the Contractor receives the notice to proceed, (b) prosecute the work diligently, and (c) complete the entire work for items 0002, 0003, and 0004 ready for use not later than sixty (60) calendar days after receipt of the notice to proceed, fifteen (15) additional calendar days from the notice to proceed for the exercised option 1, fifteen (15) additional calendar days from the notice to proceed for the exercised option 2, fifteen (15) additional calendar days from the notice to proceed for the exercised option 3 at Green Bay. The time stated for completion shall include final cleanup of the premises.

For bid items 0005 and 0009, the Contractor shall be required to (a) prosecute the work diligently, and (b) complete the entire work (including any exercised options) ready for use not later than 1 March 2013. The time stated for completion shall include final cleanup of the premises.

- (4) Be responsible for any errors that might have been avoided by complying with this paragraph (b); and
- (5) Reproduce and print contract drawings and specifications as needed.

(c) In general--

- (1) Large-scale drawings shall govern small-scale drawings; and
- (2) The Contractor shall follow figures marked on drawings in preference to scale measurements.

(d) Omissions from the drawings or specifications or the misdescription of details of work that are manifestly necessary to carry out the intent of the drawings and specifications, or that are customarily performed, shall not relieve the Contractor from performing such omitted or misdescribed details of the work. The Contractor shall perform such details as if fully and correctly set forth and described in the drawings and specifications.

The body of each wage determination lists the classification and wage rates that have been found to be prevailing for the cited type(s) of construction in the area covered by the wage determination. The classifications are listed in alphabetical order of "identifiers" that indicate whether the particular rate is union or non-union.

Union Identifiers

An identifier enclosed in dotted lines beginning with characters other than "SU" denotes that the union classification and rate have found to be prevailing for that classification. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2011. The first four letters , PLUM, indicate the international union and the four-digit number, 0198, that follows indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable , i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. The date, 07/01/2011, following these characters is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate/collective bargaining agreement which would be July 1, 2011 in the above example.

Union prevailing wage rates will be updated to reflect any changes in the collective bargaining agreements governing the rate.

Non-Union Identifiers

Classifications listed under an "SU" identifier were derived from survey data by computing average rates and are not union rates; however, the data used in computing these rates may include both union and non-union data. Example: SULA2004-007 5/13/2010. SU indicates the rates are not union rates, LA indicates the State of Louisiana; 2004 is the year of the survey; and 007 is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. A 1993 or later date, 5/13/2010, indicates the classifications and rates under that identifier were issued as a General Wage Determination on that date.

Survey wage rates will remain in effect and will not change until a new survey is conducted.

CLASSIFICATION DESCRIPTIONS

Class I - Master Mechanic - assist and direct
 Class II, Class III, and Class IV, diver/wet tender, engineer (hydraulic dredge)
 Class II-A Crane/Backhoe Operator, 70 Ton or over Tug Operator, Mechanic/Welder, assistant engineer(hydraulic dredge), leverman (hydraulic dredge), diver tender
 Class II-B Friction, Lattice Boom, or any Crane Certifications
 Class III - Deck Equipment Operator (Machineryman) Maintenance of Crane (over 50 ton capacity) or Backhoe (115,000 pounds or more), Tug/launch operator, Loader/dozer and like equipment on Barge, breakwater wall, slip/dock, Scow, Deck Machinery, etc.
 Class IV - Deck Equipment Operator(Machineryman/Fireman) (Four equipment units or more) Off Road Trucks, Deck Hand, Tug Engineer and Crane Maintenance 50 ton capacity and under or Backhoe weighing 115,000 pounds or less, assistant tug operator.

WELDERS - Receive rate prescribed for craft performing operation to which welding is incidental.
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Unlisted classifications needed for work not included within the scope of the classifications listed may be added after award only as provided in the labor standards contract clauses (29CFR 5.5 (a) (1) (ii)).

The body of each wage determination lists the classification and wage rates that have been found to be prevailing for the cited type(s) of construction in the area covered by the wage determination. The classifications are listed in alphabetical order of "identifiers" that indicate whether the particular rate is union or non-union.

Union Identifiers

An identifier enclosed in dotted lines beginning with characters other than "SU" denotes that the union classification and rate have found to be prevailing for that classification. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2011. The first four letters, PLUM, indicate the international union and the four-digit number, 0198, that follows indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. The date, 07/01/2011, following these characters is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate/collective bargaining agreement which would be July 1, 2011 in the above example.

Union prevailing wage rates will be updated to reflect any changes in the collective bargaining agreements governing the rate.

Non-Union Identifiers

Classifications listed under an "SU" identifier were derived from survey data by computing average rates and are not union rates; however, the data used in computing these rates may include both union and non-union data. Example: SULA2004-007 5/13/2010. SU indicates the rates are not union rates, LA indicates the State of Louisiana; 2004 is the year of the survey; and 007 is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. A 1993 or later date, 5/13/2010, indicates the classifications and rates under that identifier were issued as a General Wage Determination on that date.

Survey wage rates will remain in effect and will not change until a new survey is conducted.

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- * an existing published wage determination
- * a survey underlying a wage determination

- * a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- * a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour Regional Office for the area in which the survey was conducted because those Regional Offices have responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:
