



Lake Superior Water Level <i>Beginning of October 2020</i>

Forecast Outlook
The lakes are expected to continue their seasonal declines through the fall. However, water levels are expected to remain high and there will continue to be a significantly increased risk of shoreline erosion, lakeshore flooding and coastal damages as high water levels persist.
