## C-219-Oakland County Environmental Infrastructure

### Description

Oakland County is located in southeastern Michigan and includes a northern portion of the Detroit metropolitan area. This project implements the George W. Kuhn Combined Sewer Overflow Program, which includes numerous improvements to the existing system. The entire George W. Kuhn Drainage Improvement Project will be implemented through multiple construction contracts with a total cost of approximately \$144 million. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) has received a \$20 million authority to assist with infrastructure improvements. This element of the program consists of bank stabilization in the Red Run Drain.
